## What is a health and social care hub?

In Moretonhampstead we have the opportunity to make a real difference to the health and wellbeing of our community. Devon has one of the highest proportions of residents of age 65 and over and an increasing number of children and young families, so it is essential that we think carefully about the right care for our population now and for the years ahead.

At Moretonhampstead Hospital we plan to develop an 'integrated hub' with our partners which brings together health (including mental health) and social care with the voluntary and commercial sector to provide services for the community in a much more joined up way than has previously been possible.

Moretonhampstead Hospital is run by Northern Devon Healthcare NHS Trust and commissioned by Northern, Eastern and Western Devon Clinical Commissioning Group.

## What might a hub include?

We have listened to local clinicians, organisations and members of the public and just some of the ideas for NHS services and those from other partners, including the voluntary and private sector, are listed here.

This is not an exhaustive list and if you feel you are able to provide a service, please let us know; we welcome expressions of interest.

- Day care services  
(Care provided by a range of professionals who will have an input in the care of patients such as support for people living in the community, social inclusion and respite for carers)
- Social care  
(Extra non-health support for people that enables them to retain their independence and dignity)
- Mental health services  
(Such as counselling and drug/alcohol awareness)
- Audiology clinic  
(Hearing services)
- Podiatry clinic  
(Diagnosis and treatment of common foot problems, including ingrown toenails and bunions)
- Supportive social network café  
(A friendly and informal café with a welcoming and relaxed atmosphere for people with complex or complicated conditions where peer support would be beneficial)
- Optometrist  
(Eye examinations)
- Dentist
- End of life care services
- Mother and toddler groups
- Other voluntary organisations
